ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 (as amended by the Planning and Compensation Act 1991) ("the Act")

ISSUED BY: North Devon District Council ("the Council")

THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE which is issued by the Council because it appears to it that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(a) of the Act, at the land described below. The Council consider it expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material considerations.

3. THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED

Erection and residential use of 1 chalet style structure

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

The Council consider it expedient to issue this notice for the following reasons:

The site is in the Open Countryside where development should be strictly controlled in the interest of protecting the character and appearance of the landscape and on the grounds of sustainability. The erection and residential use of the structure is contrary to Policy ST16 of the Devon County Structure Plan and policies ENV1 and, HSG9 of the North Devon Local Plan.

The dwelling in question is in a countryside location outside a development boundary and within the Coastal Preservation Area. There are therefore environmental and sustainability reasons as to why it is unacceptable and it is contrary to policy ENV5 of the North Devon Local Plan

The dwelling is sited in the open countryside remote from services, employment, education, public transport and will increase the need for journeys to be made by private vehicles which is non-sustainable and in conflict with the advice in PPG13.

The Local Planning Authority considers that the above reasons for issuing the Notice cannot be overcome by the use of Planning Conditions.

5. WHEN YOU ARE REQUIRED TO ACT

The Council require that the steps specified in paragraph 6 be undertaken within the period of 6months from the date when this notice takes effect.

6. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- 1. Cease the residential occupation of the chalet style structure coloured in green on plan 2 annexed hereto.
- 2. Complete demolition of the chalet style structure coloured in green on plan 2 annexed hereto
- 3. Clear and remove all rubbish and debris from the land outlined in red on plan 1 annexed hereto, resulting from taking the above mentioned steps where so ever stored, fixed or placed.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This Notice takes effect on 30th September 2007 ("the effective date")* unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.



Honeycleave Farm, Ilfracombe EX34 8NA



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GUIDANCE NOTES FOR YOUR INFORMATION

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be received, by the Secretary of State before the effective date. The enclosed booklet "Enforcement Appeals - A Guide to Procedure" sets out your rights. Read it carefully. You may use the enclosed appeal forms. One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal. The other is for you to keep as a duplicate for your own records. You should also send the Secretary of State the spare copy of this Enforcement Notice which is enclosed.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this Enforcement Notice, it will take effect on the effective date and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period[s] specified in the notice. Failure to comply with an Enforcement Notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
