ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990
(as amended by the Planning and Compensation Act 1991) ("the Act")

ISSUED BY: North Devon District Council ("the Council")

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** which is issued by the Council because it appears to it that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(a) of the Act, at the land described below. The Council consider it expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations.

2. **THE LAND AFFECTED** (shown edged red on the plan attached)

Land Pt. OS 3087, off Wood Lane, Combe Martin, North Devon.

("the land")

3. **THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED**

Without planning permission the erection of a blockwork built building providing kennelling facilities together with a wire mesh fence compound, and a building housing a generator ("the unauthorised development").

4. **REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE**

The Council consider it expedient to issue this notice for the following reasons:

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last 4 years.

The land is within an area where the Council only normally permit development which, pursuant to its recognised Rural Policy and provisions of the Devon County Structure Plan, is necessary in the interest of agriculture. The land is also within a protected area as defined by the Coastal Preservation Policy within which only essential development is permitted. The Council do not believe that there is an agricultural or essential need for the unauthorised development such as would overcome the Policy objection. The unauthorised development represents a visual detriment to the land as part of an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

Having regard to the increase in traffic the unauthorised development can generate the road giving access to the land is by reason of its inadequate, width, horizontal alignment and condition unsuitable to accommodate the increase in traffic. In addition the junction of the land with the adjacent highway does not provide adequate visibility from emerging vehicles with consequent risk of additional danger to all road users and interference with the free flow of traffic. It also increases vehicular traffic along a designated public footpath with consequent loss of amenity and risk of additional danger and inconvenience to all users of the designated right of way.

An application for the unauthorised development has already been refused.

5. WHEN YOU ARE REQUIRED TO ACT

The Council require that the steps specified in paragraph 6 be undertaken within [the period of **THREE (3)** ~~months~~/months from the date when this notice takes effect] [~~the period of three months~~].


6. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- (i) Cease the use of the building used for kennelling facilities.
- (ii) Cease the use of the generator house building for housing the generator.
- (iii) Remove the kennel building from the land.
- (iv) Remove the wire mesh fence compound from the land.
- (v) Remove the generator house building from the land.
- (vi) Clear up and remove all rubbish and debris from the land resulting from taking the above mentioned steps.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This Notice takes effect on **21st MARCH 1994** ("the effective date")* unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

GUIDANCE NOTES FOR YOUR INFORMATION

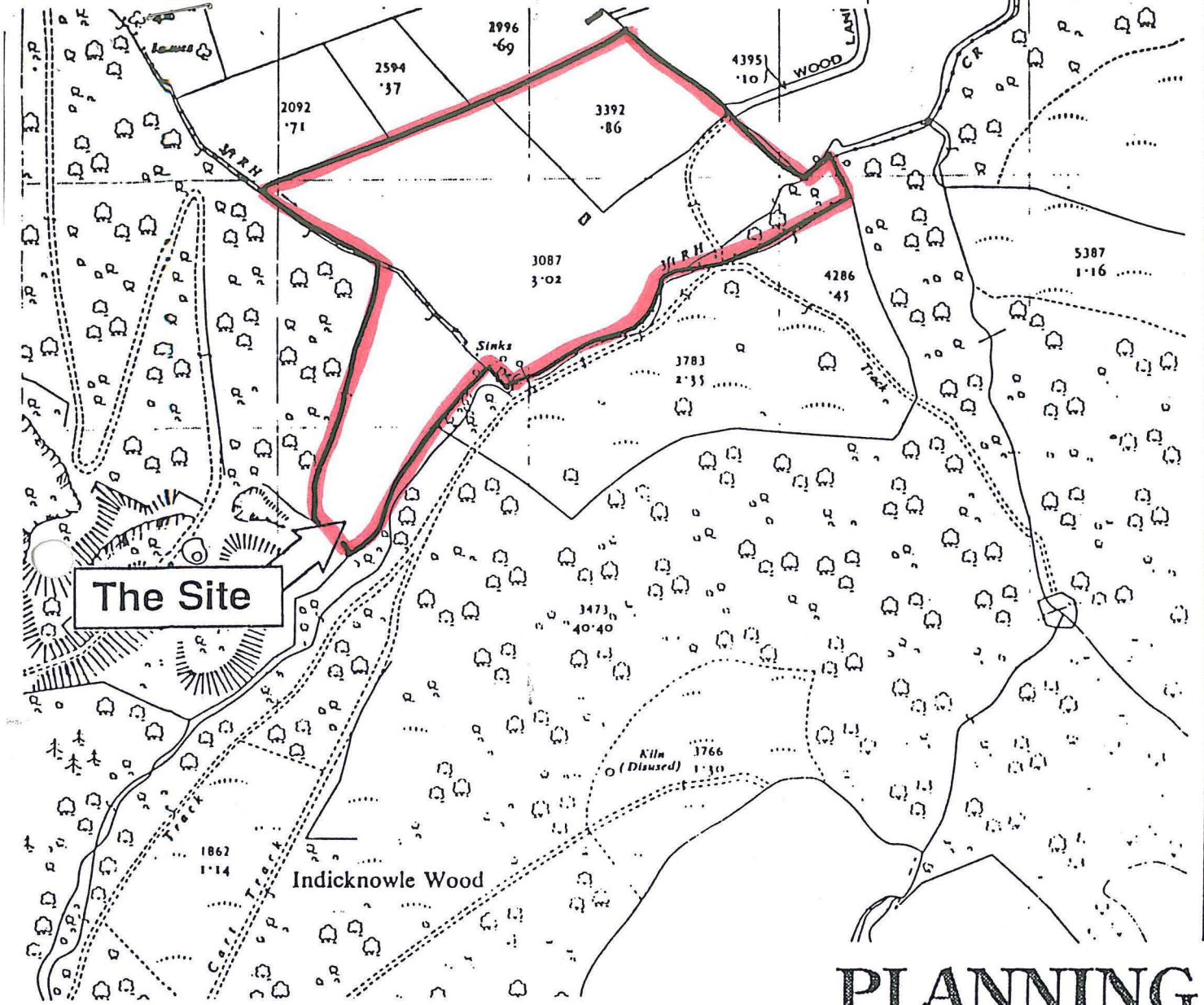
YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be received, by the Secretary of State before the effective date. The enclosed booklet "Enforcement Appeals - A Guide to Procedure" sets out your rights. Read it carefully. You may use the enclosed appeal forms. One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal. The other is for you to keep as a duplicate for your own records. You should also send the Secretary of State the spare copy of this Enforcement Notice which is enclosed.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this Enforcement Notice, it will take effect on the effective date and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period[s] specified in the notice. Failure to comply with an Enforcement Notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
