- THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE which is issued by the Council because it appears to it that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(b) of the Act, at the land described below. The Council consider it expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations.
- 2. THE LAND AFFECTED (shown edged red on the plan attached)

3. THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED

The carrying out of an engineering operation by the creation of an access from the land onto an adjoining highway by:

1. The removal of a section of Devon hedgebank.

2. The excavation of the land to road level.

3. The provision of hardcore thereon, and

4. Insertion of a wooden fence and gate therein.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

The Council consider it expedient to issue this notice for the following reasons:

The Council consider that the breach of planning control took place within the last four years.

It is the opinion of the Council that creation of the access onto the public highway results in danger to all users of the road by reason of :

(i) the limited visibility from vehicles using the access and,

(ii) the gradient of the access.

Furthermore, the absence of provision within the site for the disposal of surface water means that it is likely to discharge onto the public highway with the resultant danger to public safety.

The Council do not consider that all these issues could be satisfactorily overcome by the use of conditions.

5. WHEN YOU ARE REQUIRED TO ACT

The Council require that the steps specified in paragraph 6 be undertaken within [the period be days/weeks/menths from the date when this notice taken (first] [the period specified in respect of each step in paragraph 6].

6. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- (i) Within seven days of the effective date cease the use of the access.
- (ii) Within two months of the effective date reinstate the land to its original levels prior to the creation of the access.
- (iii) Within two months of the effective date reinstate the section of the Devon hedgebank to its original levels and condition prior to the creation of the access.
- (iv) Within three months of the effective date clear up and remove all rubbish and debris resulting from the taking of steps (i) to (iii) above.


WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL
