### ANNEX TO AN ENFORCEMENT NOTICE DATED 12TH MARCH 1990

- 1. On the 1st August 1989 a complaint was received by the Director of Planning that there was an Hawaian bar structure in the process of being built in the grounds of Lee Bay Hotel, Lee, Ilfracombe, North Devon.
- 2. On 1st August 1989 the Director of Planning's Enforcement Officer, Mr. Kenneth Spencer, visited and inspected the site.

He observed an Hawaian bar structure, not yet built, situated near to the swimming pool, opposite the main entrance to the Lee Bay Hotel, Lee, Ilfracombe, North Devon.

The Hawaian bar structure is 10.7 metres long, 5.8 metres wide, 2 cm high and about 50 metres from the hotel entrance.

- 3. After an investigation of the Local Planning Department's records it was discovered by the Hawaian bar structure did not have the benefit of planning permission.
- 4. On 4th August 1989 the Director of Planning sent a letter to Mr. Terence Thomas Blake, owner of the Lee Bay Hotel, Lee, Ilfracombe, North Devon.

It was pointed out that the Hawaian Bar structure was unauthorised and should a planning application be submitted to the Local Planning Authority to regularise the structure, the Director of Planning would recommend to that Local Planning Authority that the planning application be refused.

Mr. Blake was also advised to remove the Hawaian Bar structure by the 26th September 1989 otherwise the Director of Planning otherwise the Director of Planning would recommend to the Local Planning (Policy) Committee of 26th September 1989 to authorise the Council's Solicitor to commence enforcement action to seek the removal of the Hawaian Bar structure.

- 5. On 26th September 1989 the Planning (Policy) Committee authorised the Council's Solicitor to take enforcement action to seek the removal of the Hawaian Bar structure from Lee Bay Hotel, Ilfracombe, North Devon.
- 6. Had the owner submitted a planning application to the Local Planning Authority it would have been refused for the following reasons:
  - (a) The site is within an area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, great landscape value and the proposed development would be detrimental to the appearance of the area by reason of incongruous appearance and materials and would comprise development contrary to Policies CO7 and CO9 of the Devon County Structure Plan.
  - The site is within a protected area as defined by the Coastal Pass and Policy in the adopted County Structure Plan. Within this area only essential development would be permitted and in the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, the development now proposed is not essential and would be at variance with Policy CO10 of the Devon County Structure Plan.

- (c) The site lies within a designated Lee Conservation Area and the proposed development would detract from the appearance and character of that Conservation Area.
- 7. For the above mentioned reasons the North Devon District Council considered it expedient to issue this Enforcement Notice.




